Aldryngton Primary	45	Applicants who expressed a preference under criteria A – F and 4 in criterion G and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places based on radial distance. The last child allocated under criterion G lives 0.339 miles from the school according to the local authority’s computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 62 children in criterion G who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice.
All Saints CE (Aided) Primary	45*	All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places. 14 children have been allocated for whom no higher ranked preference could be offered as this is the designated area school or the most accessible school with places. *Four places are still to be allocated by the Special Educational Needs Team for children with a statement naming the school.
Bearwood Primary	41	Applicants who expressed a preference under criteria A – F and 5 in criterion G and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places based on radial distance. The last child allocated under criterion G lives 1.578 miles from the school according to the local authority’s computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 7 children in criterion G who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school.
Beechwood Primary	45	Applicants who expressed a preference under criteria A – F and 22 in criterion G and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places based on radial distance. The last child allocated under criterion G lives 0.874 miles from the school according to the local authority’s computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 8 children in criterion G who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice.
Colleton Primary, The	35 Number allocated 60	To ensure sufficient places within the Borough to accommodate all those applicants who applied by the deadline, it was agreed, following discussion with the school, to allocate a further 25 places at The Colleton Primary School. Applicants who expressed a preference under criteria A – F and 1 in criterion G and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places based on radial distance. The last child allocated under criterion G lives 0.874 miles from the school according to the local authority’s computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 12 children in criterion G who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice.
Coombes CE Primary, The	75	Applicants who expressed a preference under criteria A – F and 8 in criterion G and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places based on radial distance. The last child allocated under criterion G lives 2.334 miles from the school according to the local authority’s computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 19 children in criterion G who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause future infant class size prejudice.
Crazies Hill CE Primary	15	Applicants who expressed a preference under criteria A – F and 3 in criterion G and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places based on radial distance. The last pupil allocated under criterion G lives 2.704 miles from the school according to the local authority’s computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 2 children in criterion G who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause future infant class size prejudice.
Earley St Peter’s CE (Aided) Primary	70	The Governing Body considered all applications received by the deadline and agreed to make offers to all those applications meeting criteria 2 – 3. Most criterion 4 places were offered, but there were insufficient places to meet any parental preferences under criterion 6. Please note there were no applications made under criteria 1 and 5.

Emmbrook Infant	60	All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places. 5 children have been allocated for whom no higher ranked preference could be offered as this is the designated area school or the most accessible school with places. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice when the school reaches its admission number.
Farley Hill Primary	30	Applicants who expressed a preference under criteria A – C and 7 in criterion D and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places based on radial distance. The last child allocated under criterion D lives 0.948 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 35 children (19 in criterion D, 2 in criterion E and 15 in criterion G) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice.
Finchampstead CE Aided Primary	17	The Governing Body considered all applications received by the deadline and agreed to make offers to all those applications meeting criteria 1 to 5. There were insufficient places to meet all parental preferences under criteria 6 to 9. The last place offered under criterion 5 lives 2.697 miles from the school.
Gorse Ride Infant	60	Applicants who expressed a preference under criteria A – D and 6 in criterion E and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places based on radial distance. The last child allocated under criterion E lives 3.746 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 19 children (1 in criterion E and 18 in criterion G) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice.
Grazeley Parochial CE Aided Primary	15	55 applications were received and were ranked strictly according to the criteria in the Admissions Policy 2012/13. There were: None under criterion 1 (children in public care); 5 under criterion 2 (Church attendance and living in the Benefice); 6 under criterion 3 (Siblings); 36 under criterion 4 (living in the Benefice and wishing to attend this C of E school); 1 under criterion 5 (Social/medical reasons); None under criterion 6 (Church attendance outside of the Benefice); 7 under criterion 7(Living outside of the Benefice and wishing to attend this C of E school). Each criterion was also ranked using radial mileage from school. There were insufficient places to meet all parental preferences from criteria 4 to 7. The last child allocated under criterion 4 lived 0.995 miles from the school. These children have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further pupils would cause infant class size prejudice.
Hatch Ride Primary	30	Applicants who expressed a preference under criteria A – D and 1 in criterion E and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places based on radial distance. The last child allocated under criterion E lives 0.503 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 8 children (2 in criterion E and 6 in criterion G) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice.
Hawkedon Primary	70 Number allocated 90	To ensure sufficient places within the Borough to accommodate all those applicants who applied by the deadline, it was agreed, following discussion with the school, to allocate a further 20 pupils to create sufficient places in the Borough due to an exceptional demand for places. This increase enabled the authority to allocate to applicants who expressed a preference under criteria A – F and 3 children in criterion G, where no higher preference could be offered based on radial distance. The last child allocated under Criterion G lives 0.156 miles from the school. There were insufficient places for the remaining 22 children who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice.

Hawthorns Primary, The	60	Applicants who expressed a preference under criteria A – C and 26 in criterion D and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places based on radial distance. The last child allocated under criterion D lives 0.346 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 36 children (3 in criterion D, 9 in criterion E and 24 in criterion G) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice.
Highwood Primary	30*	All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places. 5 children have been allocated for whom no higher ranked preference could be offered as the as this is the designated area school or the most accessible school with places. *One place is still to be allocated by the Special Educational Needs Team for children with a statement naming the school. Admission of further children will cause infant class size prejudice when the school reaches its admission number.
Hillside Primary	60	Applicants who expressed a preference under criteria A – F and 13 in criterion G and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places based on radial distance. The last child allocated under criterion G lives 0.555 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 20 children in criterion G who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice.
Keep Hatch Primary	60	Applicants who expressed a preference under criteria A – F and 10 in criterion G and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places based on radial distance. The last child allocated under criterion G lives 0.412 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 3 children in criterion G who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice.
Lambs Lane Primary	30* Number allocated 60	To ensure sufficient places within the Borough to accommodate all those applicants who applied by the deadline, it was agreed, following discussion with the school, to allocate a further 30 pupils to create sufficient places in the Borough due to an exceptional demand for places. This increase enabled the authority to allocate to all applicants who expressed a preference for the school who applied by the deadline. 6 children have been allocated for whom no higher ranked preference could be offered as this is the designated area school or the most accessible school with places. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice. *Two places are to be allocated by the Special Educational Needs Team for children with a statement naming the school.
Loddon Primary	60	Applicants who expressed a preference under criteria A – D and 5 in criterion E and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places based on radial distance. The last child allocated under criterion E lives 1.145 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 9 children (2 in criterion E and 7 in criterion G) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice.
Nine Mile Ride Primary	50	Applicants who expressed a preference under criteria A – F and 14 in criterion G and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places based on radial distance. The last child allocated under criterion G lives 0.654 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system and was allocated over admission number in accordance with the local authority's multiple birth policy. There were insufficient places for the remaining 21 children in criterion G who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school.

Oaklands Infant	60	Applicants who expressed a preference under criteria A – F and 14 in criterion G and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places based on radial distance. The last child allocated under criterion G lives 1.045 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system and was allocated over admission number in accordance with the local authority's multiple birth policy. There were insufficient places for the remaining 6 children in criterion G who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further pupils would cause infant class size prejudice.
Polehampton CE Infant	60	Applicants who expressed a preference under criteria A – C and 28 in criterion D and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places based on radial distance. The last child allocated under criterion D lives 0.442 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 40 children (21 in criterion D, 11 in criterion E and 8 in criterion G) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice.
Radstock Primary	60	Applicants who expressed a preference under criteria A – D and 3 in criterion E and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places based on radial distance. The last child allocated under criterion E lives 0.354 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system and was allocated by the drawing of lots. There were insufficient places for the remaining 76 children (2 in criterion E and 74 in criterion G) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice.
Rivermead Primary	60	All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places. 5 children have been allocated for whom no higher ranked preference could be offered as the as the designated area school or the most accessible school with places. Admission of further pupils would cause infant class size prejudice.
Robert Piggott CE Infant	45	Applicants who expressed a preference under criteria A – F and 14 in criterion G and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places based on radial distance. The last child allocated under criterion G lives 1.889 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system and was allocated over admission number in accordance with the local authority's multiple birth policy. There were insufficient places for the remaining 12 children in criterion G who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further pupils would cause future infant class size prejudice.
Shinfield Infant & Nursery	60 Number allocated 90	To ensure sufficient places within the Borough to accommodate all those applicants who applied by the deadline, it was agreed, following discussion with the school, to allocate a further 30 pupils to create sufficient places in the Borough due to an exceptional demand for places. This increase enabled the authority to allocate to all applicants who expressed a preference for the school who applied by the deadline. 8 children have been allocated for whom no higher ranked preference could be offered as this is the designated area school or the most accessible school with places. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice
Sonning CE Aided Primary	30	The Governing Body considered all applications received by the deadline and agreed to make an offer to all those applicants meeting criteria 1 to 5. Some criterion 6 applicants were offered places based on radial distance, but there were insufficient places to meet all parental preferences under criterion 6 and remaining criteria. The last child allocated from criterion 6 lives 1.106 miles from the school. Admission of further pupils would cause infant class size prejudice.
South Lake Primary	60	Applicants who expressed a preference under criteria A – D and 9 in criterion E and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places based on radial distance. The last child allocated under criterion E lives 2.295 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 11 children (1 in criterion E and 10 in criterion G) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice.

St Dominic Savio Catholic Primary	60	The Governing Body considered all applications received by the published deadline and agreed to make offers to those applicants meeting criteria B, C, E and 7 children in criterion F. The last child allocated under criterion F lives 0.367 miles from the school. The remaining children in Category F have been provisionally placed on the waiting list based on the tiebreak of distance from home and pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the wait list for this school. No applications were received for categories A and D. Admission of further pupils would cause infant class size prejudice.
St Nicholas CE Primary	20	All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places. Admission of further pupils would cause infant class size prejudice.
St Sebastian's CE Aided Primary	24	The School's Governing Body Admissions Committee met to consider all the applications for places received by the deadline. Applicants were ranked according to the criteria stated in the school's current Admissions Policy and an offer of a place will be made to the first twenty-four on this list where no higher preference could be offered.
St Teresa's Catholic Primary	35 Number allocated 45	St Teresa's Catholic Primary School has received planning permission for a two storey extension to the front of the existing school building. Therefore, Wokingham Borough Council has approved an increase in the primary admission number, for September 2012, from 35 to 45 pupils at the school's request. There were no applicants under Category 1. The Admissions Committee allocated 45 places in accordance with the admissions policy where no higher preference could be offered, 16 under Category 2; 18 under Category 3; 4 under Category 4; 1 under Category 5; 2 under Category 7; 2 under Category 9 and 2 under Category 11 (distance from school 0.318 miles). The remaining 4 children under Category 11 (who live the furthest radial distance from the school) have been provisionally placed on the waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the wait list for this school. Admission of further pupils would cause future infant class size prejudice.
Walter Infant	90	Applicants who expressed a preference under criteria A – D and 2 in criterion E and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places based on radial distance. The last child allocated under criterion E lives 0.448 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 50 children (15 in criterion E and 35 in criterion G) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice.
Wescott Infant	56*	Applicants who expressed a preference under criteria A – C and 37 in criterion D and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places based on radial distance. The last child allocated under criterion D lives 1.263 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 39 children (10 in criterion D, 9 in criterion E and 20 in criterion G) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. There is potential that admission of further pupils would cause infant class size prejudice should more than 4 appeals for the school be upheld.
Whiteknights Primary	60	All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places. 9 children have been allocated for whom no higher ranked preference could be offered as this is the designated area school or the most accessible school with places. Admission of further pupils will cause infant class size prejudice.
Willow Bank Infant	60	All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places. 5 children have been allocated for whom no higher ranked preference could be offered as this is the designated area school or the most accessible school with places. Admission of further pupils will cause infant class size prejudice.
Winnersh Primary	60 Number allocated 90	To ensure sufficient places within the Borough to accommodate all those applicants who applied by the deadline, it was agreed, following discussion with the school, to allocate a further 30 pupils to create sufficient places in the Borough due to an exceptional demand for places. This increase enabled the authority to allocate to all applicants who expressed a preference for the school who applied by the deadline. 15 children have been allocated for whom no higher ranked preference could be offered as this is the designated area school or the most accessible school with places. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice when 90 children are allocated to the school.

Woodley CE Primary	45	Applicants who expressed a preference under criteria A – F and 2 in criterion G and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places based on radial distance. The last child allocated under criterion G lives 0.320 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system and was allocated over admission number in accordance with the local authority's multiple birth policy. There were insufficient places for the remaining 9 children in criterion G who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further pupils would cause future infant class size prejudice.

Please note that for those shaded schools, places have been allocated by the governing body of the school as they are their own admissions authority and places were allocated according to their oversubscription criteria detailed in the Parent's Guide to Primary School Admissions, on school websites or at www.wokingham.gov.uk/admissions.

KEY TO HOW PLACES WERE ALLOCATED IN COMMUNITY AND VOLUNTARY CONTROLLED SCHOOLS

The following oversubscription criteria, in order of priority, were applied when a community or voluntary controlled school received more preferences than places available:

- A Priority will be given to relevant Looked after Children
- B Children who have a serious medical, physical or psychological condition which makes it essential that they attend the preferred school, rather than any other. These reasons must be fully supported by written confirmation from the professional person involved with the family.
- C Children whose permanent home address is in the school's designated area and who have a brother or sister, or step-brother or sister or any other child (including an adopted or foster child) for whom the parent has parental responsibility, living at the same address, who will be at the school when the applicant would enter the school.
- D Children whose permanent home address is in the school's designated area
- E Children who have a brother or sister, or step-brother or sister or any other child (including an adopted or foster child) for whom the parent has parental responsibility, living at the same address, who will be at the school when the applicant would enter the school.
- F Children whose parents choose the school on denominational grounds (Voluntary Controlled schools only)
- G Any other children

For both Community and Voluntary Controlled Schools - All children with statements of special educational needs that named a school in the statement were admitted to the school that was named

If the school does not have sufficient places for children in any category, places will then be allocated on the basis of the radial distance using the local authority's computerised mapping system and the distance will be measured as a straight line between the Land and Property Gazetteer address points for the respective home address and school.
