

Unable to drive for medical reasons

You are eligible for a disabled bus pass if you have been (or would be) refused a driving licence on grounds of your medical fitness, this would typically be due to one of the following conditions:

- epilepsy (unless it is of a type which does not pose a danger)
- severe mental disorder
- liability to sudden attacks of giddiness or fainting
- inability to read a registration plate in good light at 20.5 metres (with lenses if worn)
- other disabilities which are likely to cause the driving of vehicles by them to be a source of danger to the public
- diabetes if experiencing disabling hypoglycaemia
- restricted visual field

You do not have to apply for a driving licence in order to qualify.

You are not eligible if:

- you are in possession of a current driving licence
- you are refused a driving licence on the grounds of persistent misuse of drugs and alcohol

Proof of eligibility

Please provide the following with your application:

- a letter from the DVLA confirming that your licence has been revoked or you have been refused a driving licence on medical grounds

If you receive Higher Rate Mobility Component of Disability Living Allowance, score minimum 8 points for moving around component of Personal Independence Payment or are a Blue Badge holder please follow the guidance for 'automatic eligibility'.

Alternatively, you can ask an independent medical professional to sign this form to confirm you meet the above eligibility criteria:
