

Unable to walk

You are eligible for a disabled bus pass if you have a long term (i.e. expected to last over 12 months) and substantial disability which means you cannot walk or which makes walking very difficult. You need to meet one of the following criteria:

- you are unable to walk at all
- you can only get about by swinging through crutches
- you are unable to walk more than 64 metres without severe discomfort
- it takes an excessive amount of time to walk a short distance e.g. 5 minutes to walk 100 meters
- the exertion to walk would constitute a danger to your life or would be likely to lead to serious deterioration in your health

You are not eligible if your mobility problems are short term (i.e. less than 12 months) or if you are able to walk relatively normal with the use of an artificial leg.

Proof of eligibility

If you receive Higher Rate Mobility Component of Disability Living Allowance, score minimum 8 points for moving around component of Personal Independence Payment or are a Blue Badge holder please follow the guidance for 'automatic eligibility'.

Alternatively, you can ask an independent medical professional to sign this form to confirm you meet the above eligibility criteria:
