
# North Wokingham Distributor Road - Newsletter **June 2020**



### » Work to date

This last month has been another busy one. We've been pressing ahead with the necessary operational works whilst maintaining the two-metre rule in line with Government advice and guidance. As it stands, we are still on track to complete this scheme around Winter 2021/early 2022.







## » Upcoming Works

- Embankment fill activities to develop the road construction tie-in with the Network Rail bridge. Work will include topsoil strip, a culvert, drainage layer, followed by up to 42,000 cubic meters fill material
- From mid-June there will be an increase in movement of lorries, each carrying around 20 tons of material. This is to allow us to construct a core section of the North Wokingham Distributor Road. Due to the nature of the works, as listed above in the first bullet point, noise levels are likely to be higher than normal which we appreciate may be an inconvenience. We will obviously be doing everything practical to keep any intrusion to a minimum and mitigate the impact as far as possible. We apologise in advance for any inconvenience and kindly ask you to bear with us whilst these necessary works are carried out.



- Works are planned for sections of the the A329 Reading Road marked 'night-time road closure', shown on this
  map, will be closed overnight betwen 8pm and 6am from mid-July for up to two weeks, excluding weekends. This
  is to allow us to install narrow lanes, remove two traffic islands and excavate a trench for the diversion of utilities.

- Daily public safety will remain a priority, as will access to the Emergency Services. Additionally, access for local residents will remain open at all times.

From summer 2020 to summer 2021	Peak/off peak	Reading Road	Narrow lanes TM	Lower in situ and diversion of utilities, construction of 2no property access roads and tie ins of northern and southern roundabouts
From autumn/ winter 2020	Off-peak overnight	Longdon Road	Priority give way TM and temporary traffic lights at junctions	Footway widening, construction of 2no raised tables and resurfacing

#### **Bus Stop Closure**

The Wokingham-bound bus stop, as shown, is planned to be non-operational from mid-July 2020 to mid-December 2020. This is to allow us to install narrow lanes works and to carry out essential works during this period. Please use the existing bus stops north and south of A329 Reading Road. ### » Planned Utility Works

Between now and late Summer, there is a list (available on request) of planned utility works which are scheduled to be carried out by utility providers including SSE, Thames Water, BT and SGN. The list includes: cable diversions; replacing and relocating a sub-station; lowering and diverting existing ducts; decommissioning an old chamber; installing portable mains. While these works are necessary, timings may change for reasons beyond our control.
