

PART E: Additional information relevant to the application

The land described in paragraph 4 of Part A of this form was encompassed and referenced as Sibly Hall in a Deposit of Statement and Plan submitted to Wokingham Borough Council by Blandy & Blandy solicitors (Ref: RJP/UNI/6/73) and signed on behalf of the University of Reading by Nigel Frankland on 29/03/2011.

Section 5 of the Deposit declares the University of Reading as having owned the land for more than 20 years; and the accompanying Plan 5 shows no dedicated public rights of the way over the land described in paragraph 4 of Part A of this form; Section 12 of the Deposit declared the University of Reading as having no other ways dedicated as highways and no intention of dedicating any other public rights of way over the land.

The Deposit was stamped as received by Wokingham Borough Council on 08/04/2011 and is anticipated to continue to have effect until 28/03/2021.

Therefore, there is no public right of way at the time of this application over the land described in paragraph 4 of Part A of this form.
