NOTICE is given that from Tuesday 1 July 2025 to Monday 11 August 2025 a local government elector for the area of the Council or their representative may make objections to the Council's auditor (under section 27 of the Local Audit and Accountability Act 2014) relating to any matter where the auditor could take action under:

- Section 28 of the Local Audit and Accountability Act 2014, namely, to apply to the court for a declaration that an item in the accounts is contrary to law, and/or
- Section 24 and paragraph 1 of Schedule 7 of the Local Audit and Accountability Act 2014, namely, to make a report in the public interest.

Written notice of the proposed objection and the grounds on which it will be made must be sent to the external auditors also copied to the Council at the addresses given below.
