### **NOTICE OF MAKING**

#### **WOKINGHAM BOROUGH COUNCIL (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF STOPPING, WAITING, LOADING AND PARKING PLACES) (CONSOLIDATION) ORDER 2023 (AMENDMENT NO. 4) ORDER 2026**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Wokingham Borough Council ("the Council"), in exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 32, 35, 45, 46, 49, 53, 124 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended ("the Act of 1984"), Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 and all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, has made the above Order.

#### **The Order comes into force on 1 July 2026**

The general effect of the Amendment Order will be to:

- Introduce free resident permits for residents who are in receipt of State Pension Credit.
- Clarify the eligibility criteria and evidential requirements for residents applying for free permits on the basis of receipt of State Pension Credit or possession of a Disabled Person's Badge.
- Introduce a new resident visitor day permit scheme, allowing the purchase of books of visitor permits for use within resident permit parking zones.
- Update resident permit entitlements, permit eligibility criteria and visitor permit arrangements within resident permit parking zones.
- Update the schedules identifying properties eligible for residents' permits.
- Update the associated Traffic Regulation Order map tile plans in Earley, Remenham, Twyford and Wokingham to reflect the revised permit arrangements.

Documents giving more detailed particulars of the Order may be inspected for a period of six weeks from the date of this Notice during normal office hours at Wokingham Borough Council Offices, Shute End, Wokingham, Berkshire RG40 1BN. The documents may also be viewed on the Council's website.

If any person wishes to question the validity of the Order, or any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Act, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the making of the Order, that person may, within six weeks from the date on which the Order was made, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
