NOTICE OF MAKING

**WOKINGHAM BOROUGH COUNCIL
(WOODLANDS AVENUE, WOODLEY)
(EXPERIMENTAL PROHIBITION OF WAITING AND LOADING) SECTION 3A AND 3B
ORDER 2026**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Wokingham Borough Council has made an Experimental Traffic Regulation Order under Sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act.

The Order will come into operation on **23rd July 2026** and may remain in force for a maximum period of 18 months.

Effect of the Order:

The Order introduces the following restrictions on Woodlands Avenue, Woodley:

No Waiting at Any Time (Double Yellow Lines)

- North side: From its junction with Woodwaye extending westwards to Howth Drive
- South side (opposite): From its junction with Woodwaye to Howth Drive

No Loading at Any Time

- North side: From its junction with Woodwaye extending westwards to Howth Drive

And

No Waiting at Any Time (Double Yellow Lines)

North side: From its junction with Howth Drive extending westwards to Fairwater Drive
South side (opposite): From its junction with Howth Drive to Fairwater Drive

No Loading at Any Time

North side: From its junction with Howth Drive extending westwards to Fairwater Drive

The Order is being introduced on an experimental basis to assess its impact on traffic flow and safety. The Council may modify or suspend the Order during the experimental period if necessary.

The Council will consider in due course whether the provisions of the Order should be continued in force indefinitely. Any person wishing to object to the making of an Order for the purpose of such continuation must do so in writing, stating the grounds for objection, within six months from the date the Order comes into force (or within six months of any modification of the Order, whichever is later).

If any person wishes to question the validity of the Order or any of its provisions on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that any requirement of the Act or any instrument made under it has not been complied with, that person may, within six weeks from the date on which the Order is made, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
